

# PERSONALITY COLLAGE GUIDELINES

- 1) For this project, you will create a personality collage for a character in your novel.
- 2) You are allowed to use any significant central character in the story. Some characters will be easier to portray than others will be, and I leave this up to your decision as to which one you would like to do.
- 3) The poster for this project must be a **MINIMUM** of 12"x18". It may be of any color and thickness as long as its size is equal to or greater than the 12"x18". ***I will have the option of rejecting*** and not grading any project that is turned in that is smaller than the required size.
- 4) What to do for the project: from various sources (magazines, newspapers, etc.) cut out words, phrases, and pictures that represent the character (described by himself, the narrator, or other characters). Objects connected to the character, people the character knew, or events that affected this character may all be represented in the collage. You will then paste or glue these images, pictures, words, etc. on the poster covering the entirety of it.
- 5) Somewhere on the poster (either top or middle) should be the character's name in **large enough print to let it stand out from the rest of the poster.**
- 6) **No unused or 'white space' should be left on the poster.** Every visible piece of the poster should be covered with a picture or word describing the character.
- 7) **->No more than FIVE WORDS may be written/typed on poster.** "Words" cut from magazines are fine and can be as many as you'd like. I am only limiting "created" in WordArt or typed up and put on.
- 8) Your name should be written clearly and legibly on the back of this project.
- 9) **\*You will need to number each item on the poster so that it will correspond with part two, below.\***
- 10) **MOVIE/BOOK RULE** – If a movie was made about your book, then you **MAY NOT** use any pictures from that movie or any movie connected to the book series. Nor may you put a picture **OF YOUR ACTUAL** book on the poster. Also **DO NOT** put any pictures of the actual person from your book if doing a biography. All pictures must not be directly connected to your book. I am looking to see you use your **IMAGINATION** for this.
- 11) **SECOND PART OF PROJECT**: For the last part of this project you will need to explain your choices on the poster. Using a separate piece of paper you will describe the pictures, images and words that decorate the poster.
- 12) You must have your name and class period on this separate sheet of paper.
- 13) This section of the project must be typed or neatly written in **BLUE** or **BLACK** ink. I reserve the right to not accept or grade a project that is turned in that is not typed or written neatly in **INK**.
- 14) For each picture/image/word choice on the front of the poster you will need to rationalize why you chose it for the character. This rationalization should be in a complete sentence or two and should fully explain why you selected the piece.
- 15) Each entry needs to be numbered and separated in a list much like the one you are currently reading.
- 16) You will be graded on good writing for this report. Do not be **repetitive** in your writing. **Make it interesting.** Fully explain why your chose the picture.
- 17) For an A you will need a minimum of **30** different types of items, for a B you will need a minimum of **25** different types of items, for a C you will need a minimum of **20** different types of items, and for a D you will need a minimum of **15** different types of items.
