- 1. Create your own example of a **simile** and explain why the two things are being compared.
- 2. Create your own example of a **metaphor** and explain why the two things are being compared.
- 3. Explain what a speaker in a poem is and give an example.
- 4. Give a good 6 word example of alliteration.
- 5. What is a stanza and what do we look for to know when one ends?
- 6. Give evidence to prove to us the speaker does NOT hate the girl in "One of the Seven".
- 7. Explain why the last line of "Caterpillar" would be a BAD example of alliteration.
- 8. Write an example of a simile or metaphor that could have been used in the poem "Caterpillar", but wasn't. It should reference something occurring in the poem.

Questions 9-12 refer to the poem on the back of this handout.

- 9. Explain TWO clues in the poem that are supposed to help us figure out who the speaker is.
- 10. Lines 3-4 are an allusion to an occurrence in our class. What are these lines an allusion to and explain the connection.
- 11. Explain why line 9 of the poem is an embarrassing example of a metaphor.
- 12. Connect this poem to a previous poem or story we have read in class and explain your connection.
