#### **OPTION ONE:**

Answer any TEN of the following TWELVE questions using **COMPLETE SENTENCES**. **This Week's Magic Lens Sentence** 

- 1. Pick any line from the poem "Caterpillar" and label it like we do the bellwork.
- 2. Explain why it is impossible to write a sentence with three adverbs modifying two nouns.

3. Use a FACT from the article to explain how it could connect to your current junior high life. **Living Tenderly** 

- 4. Give two good examples from the poem that demonstrate who the speaker is.
- 5. Pick a metaphor from the poem and explain what is being compared and why.
- 6. Create your own example of a simile or metaphor that COULD have been in the poem. **Rhyming Riddle**
- 7. Explain evidence in the poem that would tell us who the speaker is.
- 8. Create your own example of a simile or metaphor that COULD have been in this poem.

- 9. Create your own example of a simile or metaphor that COULD have been in this poem.
- 10. Explain the tone of the poem and how the speaker feels about themselves.
- 11. Explain the important information revealed about the speaker in the second stanza.
- 12. If you didn't know what BENEVOLENT meant in line 13, what evidence in the poem could help you define it?

#### **OPTION TWO:**

This homework is going to be a bit different. I call this my "Alphabet Phrase Homework".

You need to choose <u>ANY TEN letters</u> of the alphabet for this assignment. Once a letter has been used, it may NOT be used again. Each letter will BEGIN a phrase that describes one of the poems we read

Each PHRASE (you don't need complete sentences, just COMPLETE THOUGHTS) must have <u>no FEWER than 6 words</u> (this is where most kids will mess up), and NO MORE than 10 words.

You need to come up with 10 TOTAL phrases describing the poems listed below. You are NOT doing 10 lines PER poem, just TEN TOTAL. You may NOT LEAVE OUT any poems. Each poem you use MUST have at least TWO LINES written about it.

<u>NUMBER each one</u> you do (so it is easy to keep track), and <u>LABEL them</u> so we know which poems each line refers to.

- 1. NON-FICTION: BEING COOL IN MIDDLE
- 2. CATERPILLAR
- 3. LIVING TENDERLY
- 4. RHYMING RIDDLE
- 5. POEM ON THE BACK OF THIS HANDOUT
